Triumphalism

Triumphalism

"Already you have all you want? Already you have become rich! You have become kings-and that without us! How I wish that you really had become kings so that we might Be kings with you!" 1 Corinthians 4:8

Already and not yet

- 3And I heard a loud voice from the throne saying: "Behold, the dwelling place of God is with man, and He will live with them. They will be His people, and God Himself will be with them as their God.
- 4 <u>He will wipe away every tear from their</u> <u>eyes, and there will be no more death or</u> <u>mourning or crying or pain, for the</u> <u>former things have passed away."</u>

There is no gospel without resurrection!

What are the facts?

- Christ died for our sins in accordance to the scripture
- was buried ...
- was raised on the third day ... appeared to Cephas,
- then to the twelve,
- then to more than 500 brethren at one time ...,
- then to James,
- then to all the apostles'
- Last of all, he appeared also to me (1 Corinthians 15:3–8)

What if there is no resurrection?

- 1. If there is no such thing as resurrection, then Jesus himself did not triumph over death (still dead).
- 2. 'Our preaching is in vain' (14)
- 3. 'Your faith is in vain' (14)
- 4. 'We are misrepresenting God' (15)
- 5. 'You are still in your sins' (17)
- 6. 'Those who have fallen asleep in Christ have perished' (18)
- 7. 'We are of all men most to be pitied' (19)
