Colossians 3: 1-4

Since, then, you have been raised with Christ, set your hearts on things above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God. 2 Set your minds on things above, not on earthly things. 3 For you died, and your life is now hidden with Christ in God. 4 When Christ, who is your life, appears, then you also will appear with him in glory.

Since ... what?

- You have died with Christ; you were buried with Christ; you have been raised with Christ (see Colossians 2: 11-15, 20)
- For you died, and your life is now hidden with Christ in God. (Colossians 3: 3)
- Hidden: not visible
- Hidden: safe and secure

Only 2 possibilities; 2 mindsets

- above / below
- heaven / earth
- Above: Christ is seated at God's right hand
- Below: Satan's territory
- Above: eternal
- Below: temporary

- When was the last time you thought about things above ? (mind preoccupied with eternal things)
- When was the last time you desired something above ? (heart seeking eternal things)

So we fix our eyes not on what is seen, but on what is unseen, since what is seen is temporary, but what is unseen is eternal. (2 Cor. 4: 18)

So we don't look at the troubles we can see now; rather, we fix our gaze on things that cannot be seen. For the things we see now will soon be gone, but the things we cannot see will last forever. (2 Cor. 4: 18; NLT)




Our mindset determines ...


- set of values determining how we make decisions
- our priorities
- what we say and do

fMRI Studies

- measures brain activity by detecting changes associated with blood flow
- blood flow linked to neuron activity
- increased blood flow = increased neuron activity




Prefrontal Cortex: orchestration of thoughts and actions in accordance with internal goals



Amygdala: perception of emotions such as anger, fear, & sadness; controls aggression

Hippocampus: associated mainly with memory, long-term memory

- fMRI studies: Prefrontal Cortex, Amygdala and Hippocampus play important roles in our choices & decisions

When “heaven” is our point of focus ...

- everything will be radically transformed
- everything will be radically rearranged

Heavenly or Earthly focus determines our ...

- Attitude toward God
- Attitude toward Wealth & Possessions
- Perception of Ourselves & People
- Attitude toward Pleasure & Pain
- Commitment to a Lifestyle of Purity

Heavenly focus leads to ...

- a healthy “fear” of God
- *coram Deo*

Fear: powerful emotion

- healthy (beneficial) fear
- unhealthy (harmful) fear

What motivates our decisions/actions?

- various fears ?
- “I think we are motivated by fear, worry, dread, and anxiety much more than we realize”
- How do you make your decisions?
 - Avoiding what we are afraid of?
 - Facing our fears to venture into something unfamiliar?
- fear of God ~ trust in God ?

Defeat “little” fears with a “grander” fear

- “Only when the grander fear of God rules your heart will you be free of all the little fears in life that chip away at your heart.” – Paul Tripp
- God is “above” all other gods
- God’s power and authority is infinite
- God’s wisdom is infinite

The Fear of the Lord

- a result of knowing and experiencing God as King, Lord, and my Heavenly Father
- a result of knowing and experiencing God as the “High and Exalted One” as well as the “Suffering Servant”
- a result of knowing and experiencing God as the “Holy One” who hates sin and delights in forgiving sinners

A heavenly focus determines our ...

- Attitude toward God – healthy fear of God
- *coram Deo* - in the presence of, or before the face of God

To live *coram Deo*

- is to live our life in the presence of God
- under the authority of God
- to the glory of God

What *coram Deo* looks like for one person
