

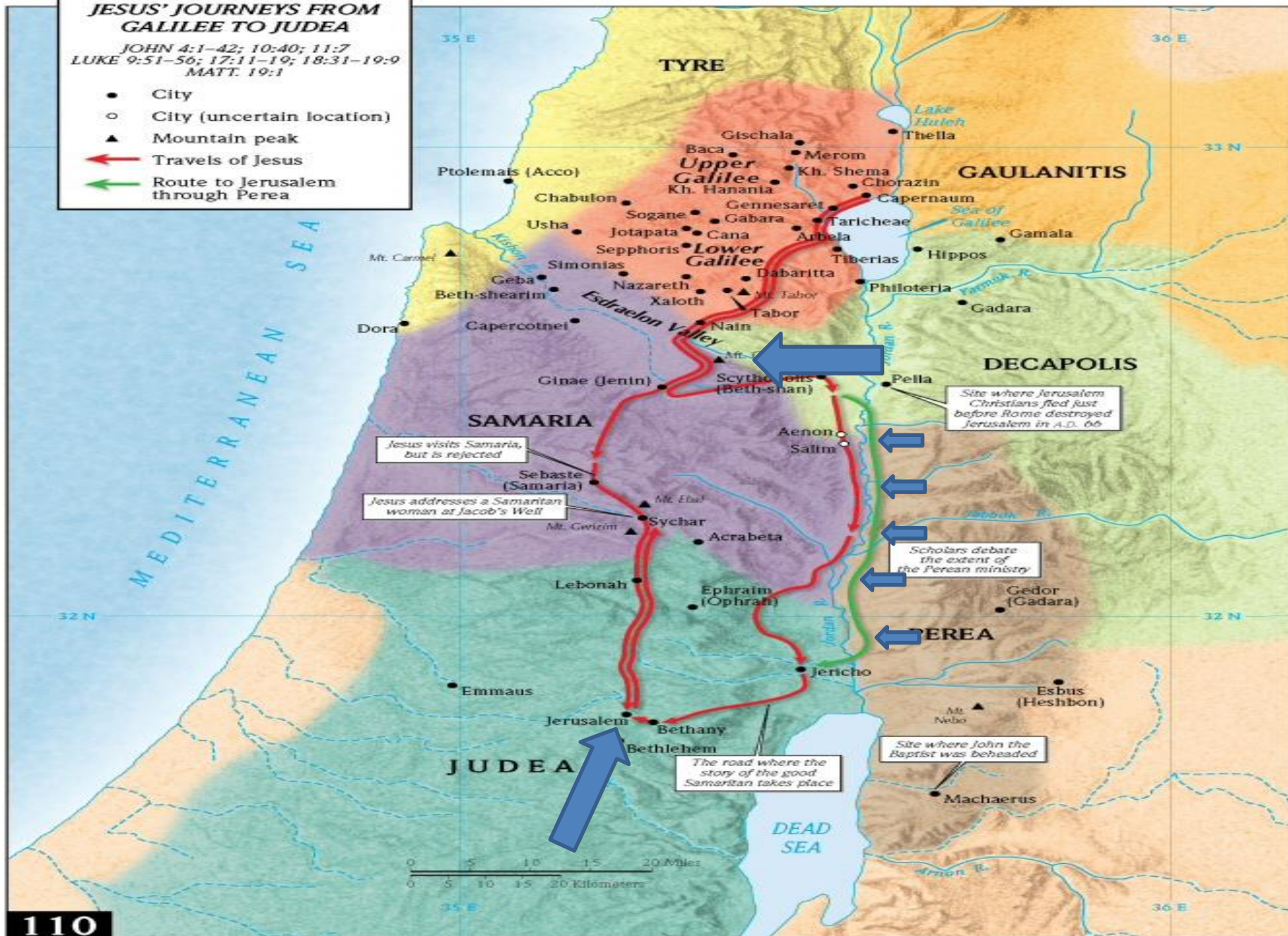

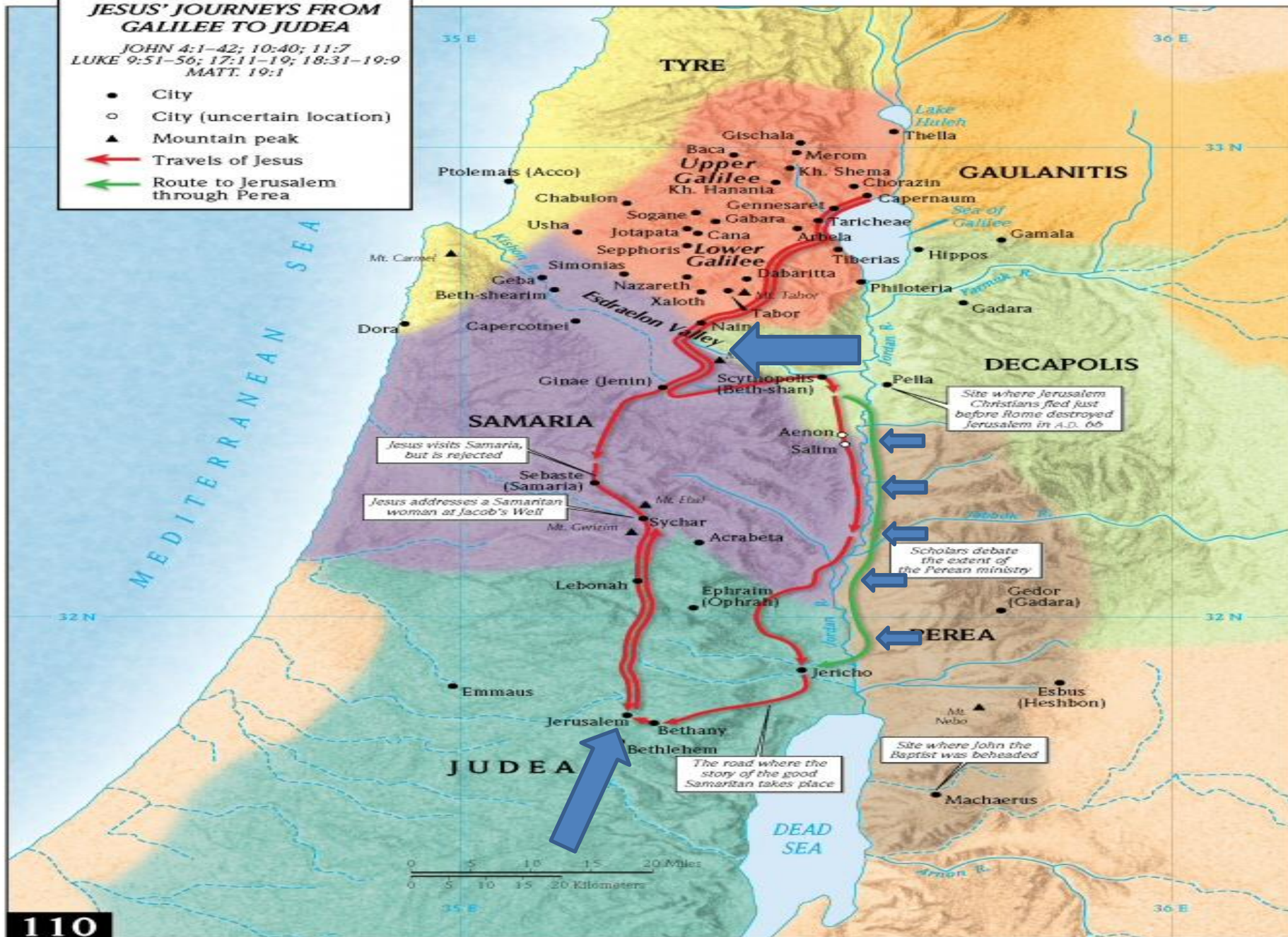

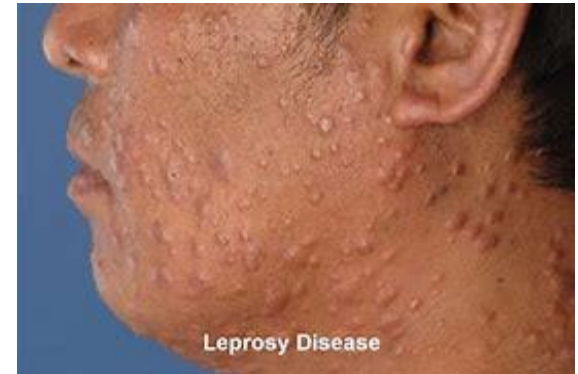

Leprosy

- a serious disease that causes painful rough areas on the skin and badly damages nerves and flesh
- a chronic infectious disease caused by a mycobacterium (*Mycobacterium leprae*) affecting especially the skin and peripheral nerves and characterized by the formation of lumps that enlarge and spread accompanied by loss of sensation with eventual paralysis (wasting of muscle), and production of deformities —called also Hansen's disease

¹⁴ When he saw them, he said, “Go, show yourselves to the priests.” And as they went, they were cleansed.

¹⁵ One of them, when he saw he was healed, came back, praising God in a loud voice. ¹⁶ He threw himself at Jesus’ feet and thanked him—and he was a Samaritan.

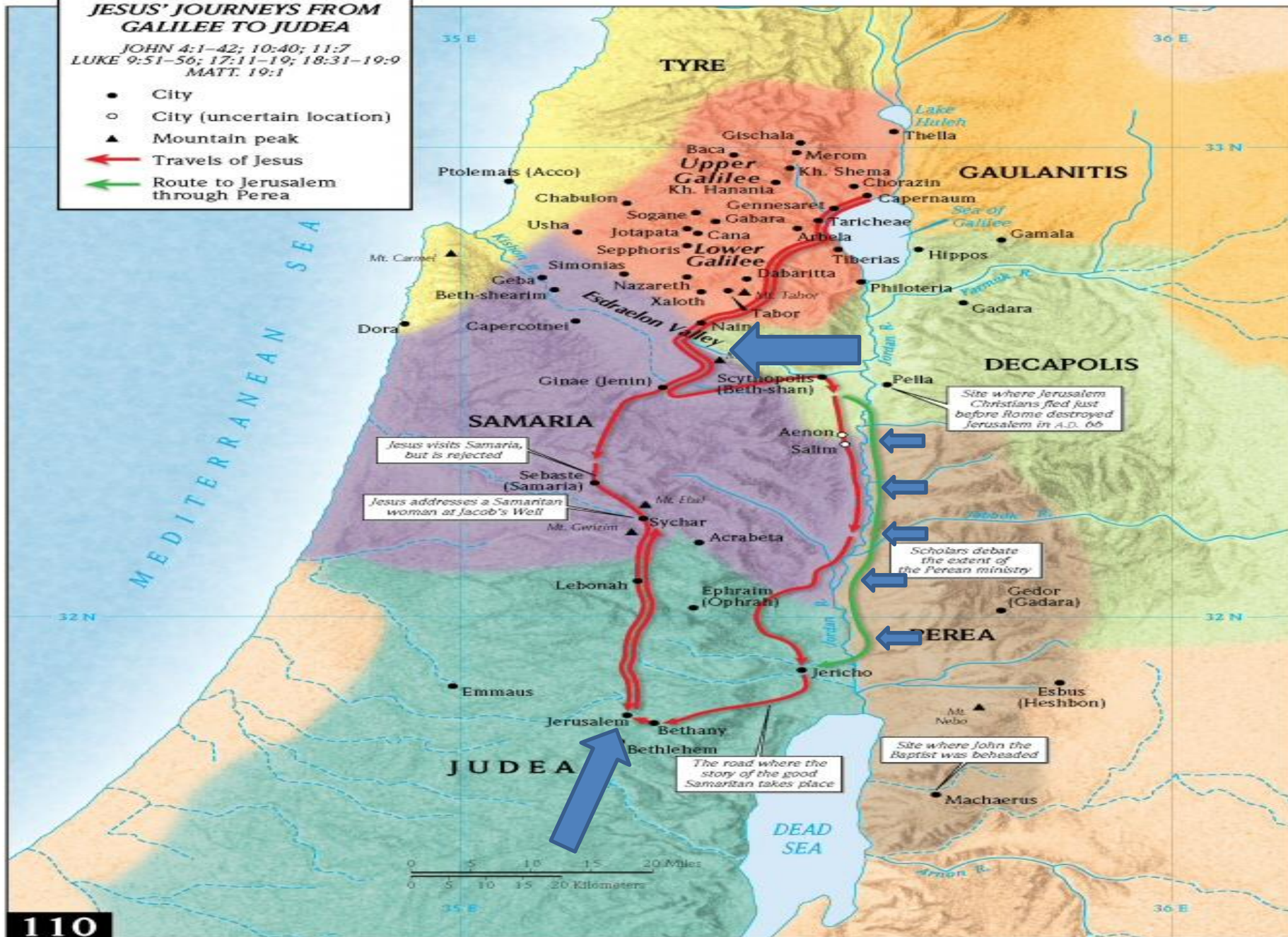
