How to overcome temptation (How the Spiritual warfare is won)

Matthew 4:1-11

Biblical usage of the word "Temptation"

- 1. "**prove by** <u>testing</u>" is done by God to determine the depth and integrity of one's commitment to God (**Abraham's sacrifice** of Issac Gen. 22:1-19, **Testing of Job** 1-2). In **NT persecution** as a 'testing' in this manner (1 Pet. 1:3-9) - if people overcame temptation (test), their faith has been enhanced and their character strengthened
- 2. Modern meaning of the word enticement leading to a deliberate act of evil against God or one's neighbor [¹³When tempted, no one should say, "God is tempting me." For God cannot be tempted by evil, nor does he tempt anyone James 1:13]
- **3. Human being's** attempt to put God to a test (manipulate God) stemming from lack of trust

¹"When Israel was a child, I loved him, and out of Egypt I called my son. <u>Hosea 11:1</u>

5 Now if you will indeed obey My voice and keep My covenant, you will be My treasured possession out of all the nations—for the whole earth is Mine. 6 And unto Me you shall be a kingdom of priests and a holy nation. These are the words that you are to speak to the Israelites." Exodus 19:5-6

¹⁰Finally, be strong in the LORD and in his mighty power. ¹¹Put on the full armor of God, so that you can take your stand against the **devil'**s schemes. ¹²For our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the powers of this dark world and against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly realms. Ephesians 6:10-12

Satan's identity (Old Testament)

- He was named <u>Lucifer</u> before his fall.[Isa. 14:12]
- He was the perfection of wisdom and beauty [Ezek. 28:12]
- 3. He was in Eden. [Ezek. 28:13]
- He was the <u>anointed cherub</u> of God.[Ezek. 28:14]
- 5. He fell through **pride**. [Ezek. 28:17]
- 6. He <u>wanted to be like God</u> and He attempted to steal God's throne. [Isa. 14:13, 14]
- 7. He was at the garden of Eden causing Adam and Eve to sin [Gen. 3:1, Rev. 12:9, 20:2]

Satan's control (New Testament)

- ⁶ And he said to him, "I will give you all their authority and splendor; it has <u>been given to me</u>, and I <u>can give it to anyone I want to</u>. [Luke 4:6]
- ³¹ Now is the time for judgment on this world; now the <u>prince of this world</u> will be driven out. [John 12:31]
- ⁴ <u>The god of this age</u> has blinded the minds of unbelievers, so that they cannot see the light of the gospel that displays the glory of Christ, who is the image of God. [2 Corinthians 4:4]
- ¹⁹ We know that we are children of God, and that the <u>whole world is under the control of the evil</u> <u>one</u>. [1 John 5:19]

Satan (believer's reaction to him)

- ⁷Submit yourselves, then, to God. <u>Resist the devil</u>, and he will flee from you.[James 4:7]
- ⁸ Be alert and of sober mind. Your enemy the devil prowls around like a roaring lion looking for someone to devour. ⁹ <u>Resist him</u>, <u>standing firm in the faith</u>, because you know that the family of believers throughout the world is undergoing the same kind of sufferings.[1 Peter 5:8-9]
- ³⁷ No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. [Romans 8:37]
- ¹⁰ Finally, be strong in the Lord and in his mighty power. ¹¹ Put on the full armor of God, so that you can take your stand against the devil's schemes.
 [Ephesians 6:10-11]

Comparison

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<u>All of</u> Satan's Tempting power	Temptation at the Garden of Eden	Temptation in the wilderness
Appeal to physical appetite	You may eat of any tree (Gen. 3:1-3)	You may turn stone into bread (Matt. 4:3)
Appeal to personal gain	you will not die (Gen. 3:5-6)	You will not hurt your foot (Matt. 4:6)
Appeal to <u>power</u> <u>and glory</u> (shortcut)	You will be like God (Gen. 3:4)	You will have all the world's kingdom (Matt. 4:9)
